Overview of TPEF Teacher Grant Funding

- First grant was awarded in October, 2008
- A total of \$\$116,040 has been awarded directly through teacher grants
- A total of 297 awards have been presented
- 146 Taos Municipal School District educators/support staff have received at least one TPEF grant since the initiative was launched

Fall 2014 Application Cycle

- 93 applications received (55% increase from last year)
- 68 applications were reviewed by committee process and presented to TCF fundholders/donors for funding selection consideration
- 59 applications will be awarded 24 to teachers as first time applicants
- Total Grant Award Docket presented =\$22,622
